MEA Executive Board Elections - 7 Positions

The following seven two-year term Executive Board Positions are open for nomination by any MEA member.

PRESIDENT

Responsibilities of MEA President:

- Familiar with all areas of Association work (contracts, bargaining, parliamentary procedure, structure of PUC/WEA/NEA) as well as MEA Bylaws, MEA Financial and Operational Procedures, files, and records.
- Supervises and evaluates the MEA Administrative Assistant.
- Organize, conduct, and plan meetings in preparation for MEA Bargaining, Representative Council meetings, Executive Board meetings, LMC, SpEd LMC, and other committees.
- Attends PUC Meetings, PUB Meetings, school board meetings, and other leadership meetings.
- Spokesperson for the local unit to members, school board, community, and the press.

SIX EXECUTIVE BOARD POSITIONS: High School, Middle School, Elementary School, and 3 additional at-large positions

Responsibilities of Member-at-Large:

- Attends Executive Board meetings and Representative Council Meetings.
- Takes a leadership role in association business and attends MEA events.
- Reflects the concerns of all members and represent their interests when taking part in MEA decision making.
- Upholds MEA Bylaws and Financial and Operational Procedures.

WEA Representative Assembly

The WEA Representative Assembly meets once a year and is the highest decision-making body of the Washington Education Association. **All MEA members are eligible to be a delegate.** MEA covers the cost of transportation, hotel, and meals for Delegates. The 2023 WEA RA is scheduled to be held in Spokane April 13-15 (please note this is during Mukilteo SD Spring Break), Mukilteo is allowed nineteen delegates. Interested members may be nominated by other members or may self-nominate.

Responsibilities include:

NEA Representative Assembly
